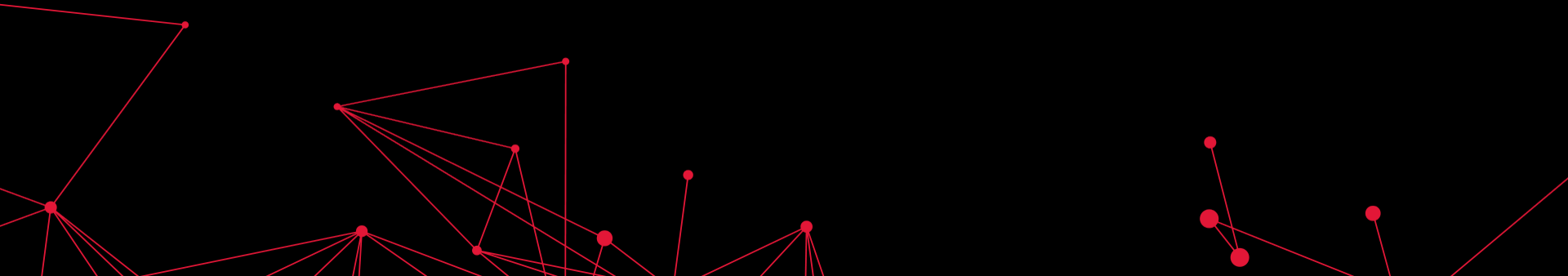

# Bearcat Promise

- **Career Planning:** Begins the first year through exposure to planning tools, articulation of aptitudes, preferences and values, exploration of professional possibilities, and goal identification.
- **Career Learning Outcomes:** Embedded in curriculum to ensure career preparation for all UC undergraduate students.
- **Career Studio:** Launched in November 2019, provides walk-in career support, student workshops and employer events.






# **Cincinnati Tuition Guarantee Program**



# Cincinnati Tuition Guarantee Program

- Establishes a “frozen” tuition rate particular to each academic year
  - Tuition rate is guaranteed for four (4) or five (5) years, depending on the undergraduate degree-seeking student’s degree program
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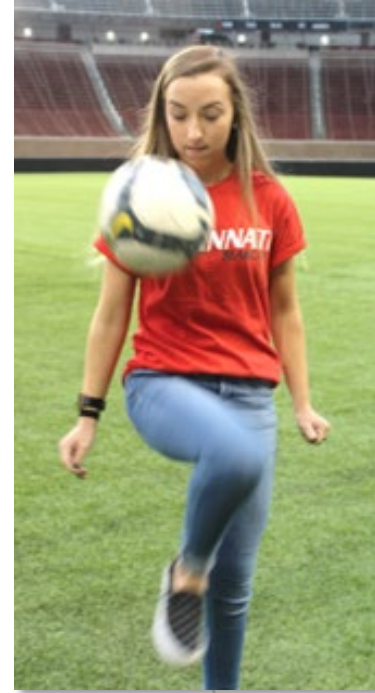

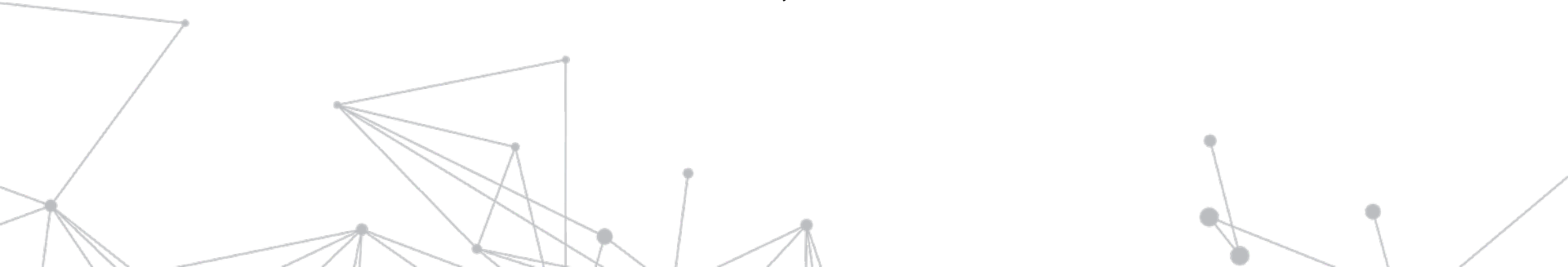

# Cincinnati Decision Day



- Admission decisions will release on **Monday, January 24, 2022**
- For first-year students who apply to Uptown by December 1 (exception: CCM)
- Starting mid-October, students who submit a complete application specifically for a regional campus will receive a decision within 2 weeks

## First Year Students

### Required Materials

- Common Application
- Application Fee (or fee waiver)
- Official High School Transcript, Unofficial High School Transcript, or SRAR Submission

### Optional Materials

Test-Optional for Fall 2022

- Most programs are test-optional for fall 2022
- Exceptions include Nursing and Early Childhood Education

- Students will have a window of opportunity to change their mind

- Nursing
- Early Childhood Education

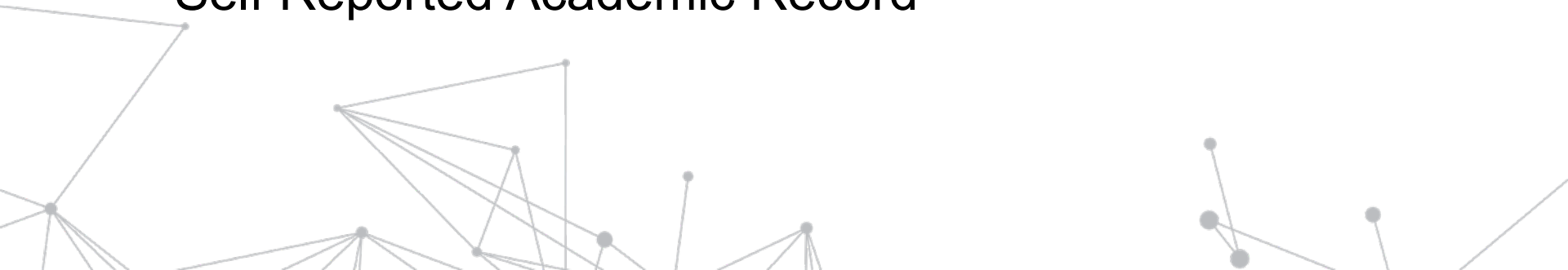
No longer required for University Honors Program

Students will be considered for scholarships without a test score if they meet the December 1 deadline





    - Foundational Studies in Allied Health Sciences
    - Exploratory Studies
  
  - Admit and refer to regional campus
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# Holistic Review Process

- Overall, does the student meet desired readiness of the academic program (quantitative and qualitative)?
  - How did the student perform in the context of their environment? Rigor in coursework? Grade trends? Engagement outside of the classroom?
  - What does their application tell us about their character? Are they well-rounded? A leader? Committed? Disciplined? Show grit?
  - What does the essay, personal statement, and letter of recommendation (if available) say about the student that aligns with the academic program and campus community?

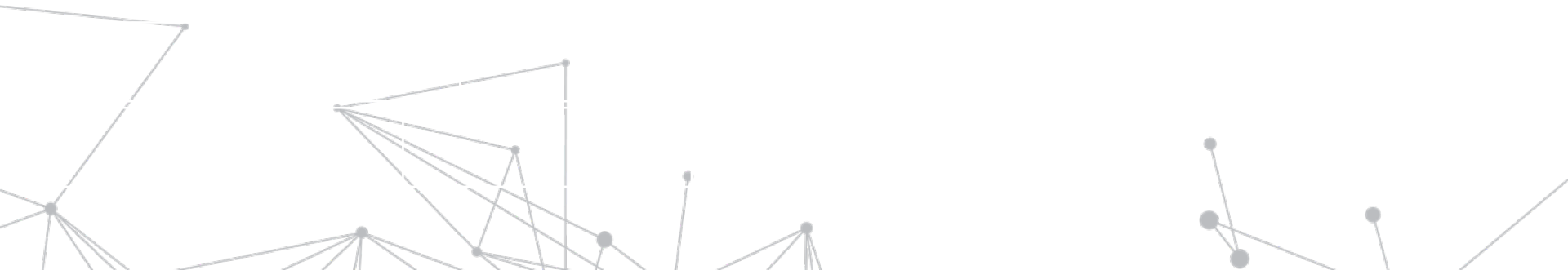

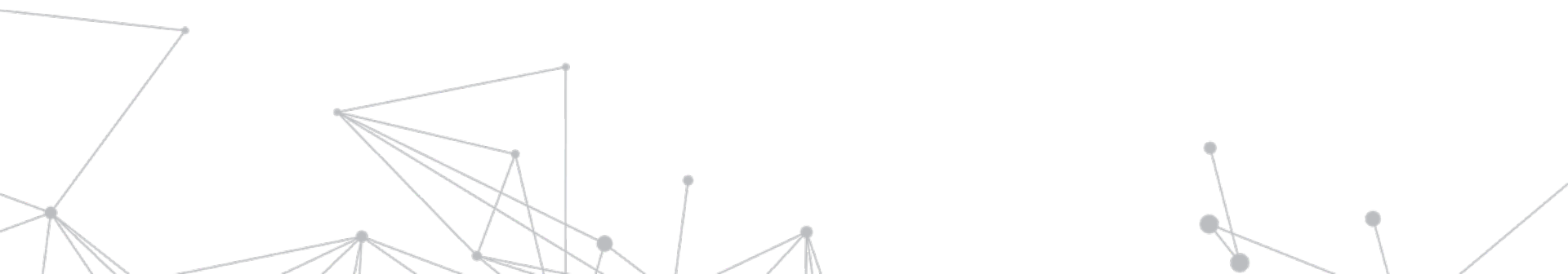

English (Verbal)	18	480 (Evidence-Based Reading and Writing)	n/a	5
Math (Quantitative)	22*	530*	420*	n/a

\*higher score may be required to meet course pre-requisites.  
UC will consider the highest scores across multiple tests for admission.  
Students must be college-ready in both English and Math to meet UC's eligibility guidelines

**Pre-Term Notice of Admission** – Initial student enrollment prior to the start of semester

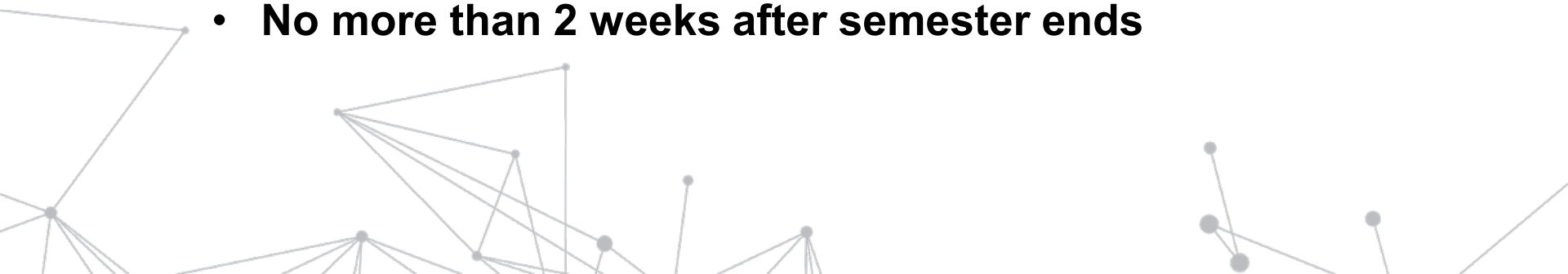
- Ongoing

**Pre-Term Notice of Enrollment** (includes Options A or B participation)

- 2 weeks before 1<sup>st</sup> day of semester; 1<sup>st</sup> day of classes; 2 weeks after semester begins

**Final Grades** -

- No more than 2 weeks after semester ends



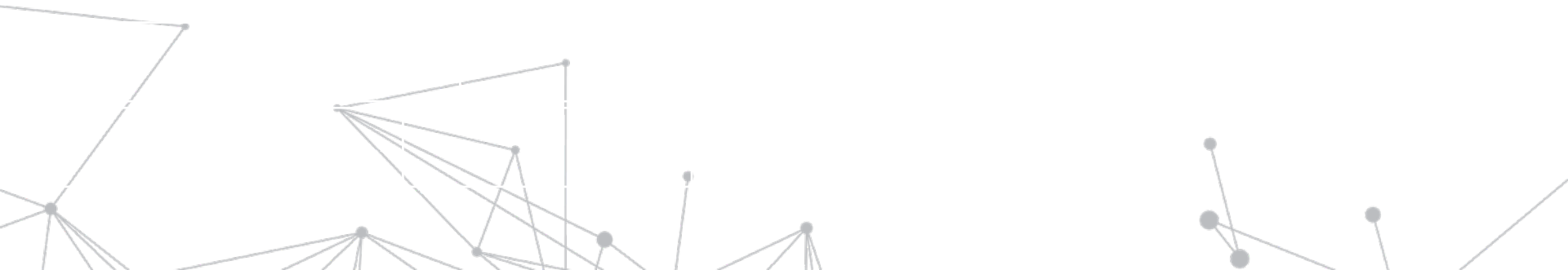
# UC CCP Listserv


